

We sincerely regret to announce that Mr. Richard Simpson Gundry, C.B., died on March 13 at Hillworth Cottage, Devizes, at the age of 85, says "The China Express." His name has long been a household one in China circles, where his death will cause many sincere regrets, though he had had a

long and useful life. Always a great walker, his health was doubtless to be attributed to this exercise, which in summer time he interpolated with bowls. The son of Richard Hickley Gundry, of Hillworth Cottage, Devizes, he was born in 1838, and was educated privately and at Brussels. He first went out to the East on the staff of the "Times of India." In 1865 he became editor of the "North China Herald," and was also "Times" correspondent in Shanghai during the period till 1878. It was a time full of interest. The year before had been marked by the signal defeats inflicted on the Taiping rebels and Gordon, the Imperialists by in by revolts Yun-nan followed and among the Central Asian tribes, in consequence of which China first appeared as a borrower in foreign markets. The period also embraced the foreign Minister's first right of audience with the Emperor, and covered also part of the long rule of the great Dowager Empress, the murder of Mr. Margary, which nearly led to a war with England, the Chefoo Convention, which secured the right of foreigners to travel throughout the Chinese Empire, and the terrible famines of 1877 and 1878 in Shan-si and Shantung. Of these and other events Gundry was the shrewd and well-informed chronicler. Apart from his werk with the China Association and his contributions to reviews, he was the author also of two most important books. dealing respectively with "China and Her Neighbours," being studies of Indo-China Russia and France in and India and Tibet, pub-China. lished in 1893, and "China Present and Past," published in 1895. He also published at Shanghai, in the 'seventies. "Sketches of Excursions to Chusan, Pootoo, Nanking and Kioto." The funeral took place at Devizes cemetery on March 17. NLB
