Bandits Kidnap 2 Tamil Labourers

KUALA LUMPUR, Friday.

BANDITS from the Kajang area of Selangor raided Braemar Estate shortly after dawn this morning and kidnapped two Tamil labourers. A third Tamil escaped after being stabbed and seriously wounded.

When the Coldstream Guards were ambushed at Sungai Ras, in the Tapah area, Perak, on Wednesday, it is learnt that two bandits were killed and a third seriously wounded but escaped.

The Security Forces recovered a rifle, a Sten gun and a hand-grenade. Of the four Guardsmen, two of whom were seriously wounded, one is dangerously ill.

Seventeen black suits, a Communist flag and a quantity of Communist documents were found when the Seremban jungle squad carried out a raid on a Chinese kongsi in the Bukit Bemban area in the Mambau District of Negri Sembilan.

A Chinese, who was in the kongsi at the time of the raid, was arrested

“DANGEROUS BOYS 13,
